## Making a difference



## Kirklees Youth Enterprise Centre

This new centre is building a culture which nurtures and promotes enterprise in young people across Kirklees. Focusing on the creative and media sector, it exists to encourage young people who show entrepreneurial flair. Support offered includes test trading, business mentoring, enterprise days, entrepreneur exchanges, 'dragon's den', challenges and example companies.

## Energy innovation in deprived communities

This EU-funded research project aims to deliver a new approach to energy efficiency and renewable energy projects in the most deprived communities within Yorkshire & Humber. It targets particularly hard-to-treat homes, such as solid wall properties and those where regular energy efficient measures are not possible.

This will in turn prepare the region to take advantage of the government's proposed Green Deal aspirations which will create 250,000 new jobs by 2030.

194,100 are employed in Kirklees. That's **194,100 people who are better off** because of 28 days leave a year, an 11-hour break between shifts and work-specific health and safety rules.

In Kirklees there are **52,100 part-time workers**, all of whom benefit from an EU entitlement to the same hourly pay as full-time workers and have the same leave entitlements.

There are **87,700 women** employed in total in this area. Thanks to the EU, they have protection from dismissal if pregnant, the right to be paid the same as men for work of equal value, and laws protecting them against discrimination.
